
This wetland restoration will maintain and enhance the ecological values of natural areas within Te Toke Forest and facilitate the long-term enhancement of the ecological health of the area.

Project goals:

- To enhance existing indigenous vegetation, and restore areas of nonplantation exotic vegetation to indigenous vegetation that is consistent with naturally occurring habitats likely to be present in the area prior to human influence.
- To identify and restore areas of predominantly exotic vegetation that act as
 protective buffers to the wetlands, and that are that are unsuitable for
 forestry.
- To ensure that works planned do not conflict with any potential future use of the land, which is currently in commercial forestry.
- To restore indigenous character to the site through enhancement of existing vegetation and re-establishment of indigenous vegetation that was likely to have occurred naturally within the project site or in the immediate vicinity.
- To develop a restoration approach that allows development of the property in a cohesive manner on a long-term basis as resources allow, to maintain existing values and to enhance the ecological values of the area in the longterm.
